## Heritage Week ~ February 15-20, 2016 Distinctive Destinations: Experience Historic Places

Heritage Week is an annual celebration of Canada's history and heritage. This year the theme for Heritage Week is "Distinctive Destinations: Experience Historic Places", and we've got a couple of exciting historic "destinations" to visit this month.

During Heritage Week Piccadilly Mall has many historic exhibits and displays. This year the museum exhibit features the history of passenger transportation in the Okanagan Valley, with emphasis on CPR's Shuswap & Okanagan Railway. Check it out during mall hours between Monday, February 15<sup>th</sup> and Saturday, February 20<sup>th</sup>. Museum volunteer and railroad enthusiast Peter Vander Sar will be at the mall afternoons and evenings on Thursday, Friday, and Saturday to talk about railway travel in the valley.

Enderby's historic hotels and pubs will be the "destination" of the evening for Heritage Night, starting at 7:00 pm at the museum on Friday, February 19<sup>th</sup>. Our guest presenter is museum president John Brennan, who has been busy gathering stories from long-time residents in our community and digging for historical tidbits in the archives.

## Curator's Report

Since this is the first issue of the museum newsletter in 2016, I guess it's not too late to wish you all a Happy New Year...even though we're already in February. Where does the time go?!

This winter I was able to implement skills that I learned from the Collections Management course that I took last year by beginning a review of our artifact collection. The purpose of the review is to identify gaps in our collection, determine which objects are duplicates, and pinpoint artifacts that require conservation after 37 years of preserving our area's history for future generations to enjoy.

We will also enter the accession records that we have created about every object in our collection into a computer database. The records from mid-1999 to the present have already entered, but after all the records are on the computer it will make it much easier for us to conduct research and find information.

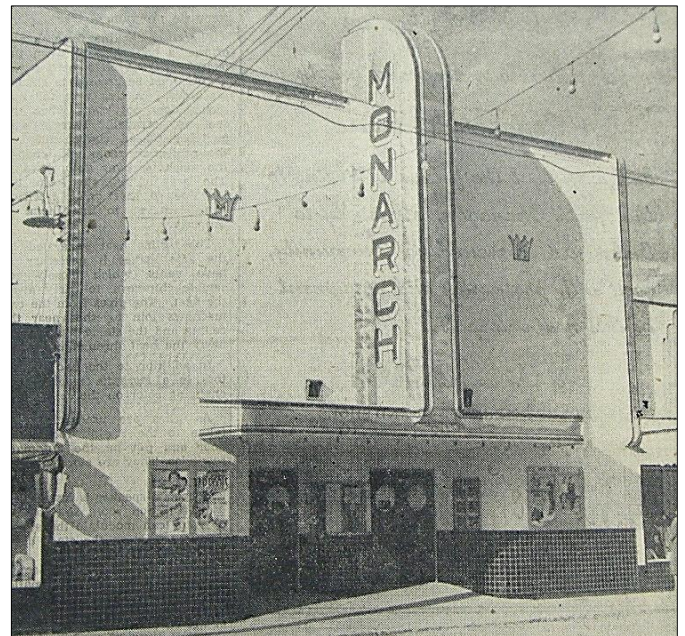
